finished writing the resume, we heard a presentation from Mr. Hrbik, a lawyer from the German-Czech chamber of commerce. He told us a lot about the purchase contract in Czech Republic. There are a few differences to Germany, for example when you get an offer, maybe via E-Mail, and you change something, when you send it back and the other one don't say that he won't make a contract with you on this conditions, the purchase contract is valid. In Germany this is a new offer and the other one has to accept it before the contract is signed. There isn't a separation in first right and second rights, too. They just make a difference between how substantial the damage is. On the other side, there are some things close to the German purchase contract law.

Then we had a little break. On the afternoon we build groups – every group represents the virtual project company which was founded in March - and Mr. Hrbik played a costumer and had ask us, when the purchase contract was signed while he was buying a social game from us. He explained that in Czech Republic normally there is just a 14 days reclamation time if an agent brings you into the shop but there is one exaptation – when nobody from the job told you about this, you can give back the product for one year and 14 days.

We talked a bit about Czech and German law and then we finished school for this day- well, that doesn't mean, that we had finish for the day.
